The Teen Center continues to be staffed and open for drop-in use 6 days per week and was open a total of 25 days in September. Throughout September, a total of 2,238 teens visited the Teen Center and Teen Center Basketball Court based on the hourly attendance added up for each day of the month. Throughout the month of September, the Teen Center hosted twice daily activities to encourage more attendance. Lastly, the Teen Center hosted the first Teen Advisory Committee Meeting of the 23-24 school year.

Checkout Building

On September 5, Recreation Supervisor Rachel Cummings transferred to the Checkout Building to Supervise Checkout operations and staff. On September 19, a staff meeting and training was held with all Checkout Staff. Other additions and implementations since September 5 include the introduction of a staff cell phone, weekly staff updates, distribution of weekend staff memos, and morning staff coverage at the front desk to assist the Recreation Specialist.

Fields and Courts Use

Beginning in October, reservations will be tracked by user groups.

Tennis, Pickleball, and Volleyball Courts

The Fall Pickleball League began the week of September 11. The league takes place on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, and utilizes all of the pickleball courts and on some days additional tennis courts for a few hours. There are 11 different divisions and 85 teams participating in the Fall league. In addition to the leagues, the department offers Pickleball clinics and lessons through contract instructors, Nathan Staso and Scott Crandall which also began the week of September 11.

Fall tennis classes with Jaguar Tennis Academy began the week of September 11 and will continue through December.

The tennis courts are reserved weekday afternoons for El Segundo High School Tennis.

Ball Fields

Stevenson Field was reserved by El Segundo Babe Ruth and Beach City Baseball Academy. The softball field was used for youth sports and the El Segundo Girls Softball team.

Raytheon Field was reserved for El Segundo Girls Softball, El Segundo Little League, and patrons' private soccer leagues.

Racquetball Courts

The Racquetball Courts remain closed due to poor and unsafe conditions.




