1. Standing Plunge Update

## 2. User Group Success Criteria

The committee members requested treating the aquatics programs like the field programs in the City by requesting rosters for all club teams. The committee discussed the possible removal of or amendment to the non-profit status. All parties agreed that there should be an incentive put in place for user groups to complete their success criteria documents.

# 3. Aquatics Fee Review

The committee requested that staff return with options for offering subsidized aquatics programming based on financial need. There was a request made for additional swim lessons to be offered in the city. Staff will look into options for having contract instructors teach swim lessons.

# 4. Aquatics Manager Job Description

The committee agreed to move forward with the Aquatics Manager recruitment maintaining a focus on programs and user groups instead of economic development.

5. Pool Heater Litigation Update No update was provided.

Christopher Godrey requested weekday time in the pool for Coastal Masters Water Polo.

Tim Arnold suggested that Beach Cities Swimming could contract their staff members as swim instructors with the city. Beach Cities Swimming is planning to host a swim meet on November 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> but they are having difficulty renting the Wiseburn parking lot.

Mel Quo, Beach Cities Swimming, is looking for opportunities for his organization to volunteer in the City. He is hoping to get the Wiseburn parking lot secured for their November 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> swim meet.

Members confirmed that there are long-standing concerns with parking at the El Segundo Aquatics Center. They requested that member Mancini focus on an agreement amendment to include parking for swim meets at the El Segundo Aquatic Center.

# **D.** ORDER OF BUSINESS

1. Standing Plunge Update

Member Lormans provided an update including concerns he and member Palmer shared these concerns with the architecture development team. Member Mancini informed the subcommittee that she is working on funding for the Plunge renovation.

2. User Group Success Criteria

Member Lormans sent the success criteria form to the ESAC user groups. The subcommittee confirmed that the goal of the success criteria is to follow up with the user groups and an evaluation of how the City is doing with its aquatic programs. Member Watson suggested

creating an allocation policy, like the Field Allocation Policy.

# 3. Aquatics Fee Review

Member Palmer provided rate comparisons to surrounding cities and the option for a scholarship program. The subcommittee agreed to update the aquatics rates to be presented to the City Council.

Member Giroux updated the subcommittee on the progress being made with the pool heater litigation.

Member Mancini informed the subcommittee that the Aquatics Manager position has been posted.
